



New England Wildlife Center Internship Program

The primary mission of the New England Wildlife Center is to promote positive values, behaviors and policies toward wildlife and the environment through the medical care and rehabilitation of, education about and humane research into native and naturalized wild animals and exotic pets.

Exciting intern positions available! New England Wildlife Center interns will work with internship coordinator, Dr. Robert Adamski, and will experience:

- Active participation in medical care of both wildlife and exotic companion animals (e.g. bandaging/splinting, administering meds, helping with diagnostic procedures such as x-rays and bloodwork, and helping with anesthesia and surgery.
- Daily educational rounds including necropsies, learning about common diseases and wildlife conservation issues.
- Opportunities for working with mammal, avian and reptile species.
- Working with Center veterinarians and exotic companion animals in our commercial veterinary practice *The Odd Pet Vet*.
- Working to help educate people about common problems encountered by wildlife here in New England.



The summer season (June 1st to August 31st) is the busiest time of year for internship applications. Interns are encouraged to participate in the internship program for 6 - 8 weeks. The deadline for application to the summer program is February 15th. Interns during the non-summer months are encouraged to attend for a minimum of 5 weeks and may extend their internship longer than the typical 8-week period. Fall, winter and spring seasons do not have a deadline - applicants are accepted or denied on a rolling basis. These internships are non-paid positions during which you will gain much experience and knowledge.
